Communication From Throughout the Grades



Grade 5

Reminders:

As we approach the halfway point of this school year, we in the grade 5 pod, would like to thank the students for all their hard work and dedication to learning.

For Valentine's Day this year, each grade 5 class will decide individually how they will recognize it. We do encourage the exchange of Valentine's cards; however, please keep in mind an all or none policy exists in regards to Valentine cards here in the grade 5 pod. If your child is bringing cards for their classmates, please include all students in the class. Thank you for your help in this matter. Classroom teachers will be making a class list available for their students.

The school is having our Winter Active Day on Friday, February 15th.

LA: We have been working through a Figurative Language unit with a focus on metaphors, similes, hyperbole, alliteration, personification and onomatopoeia. Students have been identifying examples in poetry and their chapter books.

Math: 5A: We have just finished working with whole numbers in our Place Value unit, and will be looking at decimals next. Students will learn to write numbers including tenths, hundredths and thousandths in a variety of ways.

Math: 5B, C, D: We will be finishing up our division unit in the next couple of weeks and then moving on to Patterns. Students can practice long division at home to help prepare for the test.

Social: We are finishing up our study of the Canadian Shield region by encouraging travelers to come to this wonderful region by creating travel brochures. Next up on our tour of Canada is Canada's smallest region, the Great Lakes/St. Lawrence Lowlands or the Arctic region.

Science: 5D: We are starting our new unit; Electricity and Magnetism. Students will learn about electrical safety, magnetic fields, how electricity is measured and used in our homes, and build electrical circuits.

Science: 5 A, B, C The students are currently working on their electrical projects. Once completed, the students will present their work to their classmates.

Grade 6

LA: 6A, B, C: We've kicked off 2019 with a poetry unit that allows students to explore different poems as well as figurative language. Familiarity with both of these topics will be critical for the Provincial Achievement Exams this spring. After poetry we will move on to writing newspaper articles, and focusing on the organization of critical information in a prescribed format. Students continue their exploration of words and letter patterns with their weekly word study, while squeezing in 15 minutes of daily reading time.

LA: 6D & 6E: We've kicked off 2019 with a poetry unit that allows students to explore different poems as well as figurative language. Familiarity with both of these topics will be critical for the Provincial Achievement Exams this spring. After poetry we will move on to writing newspaper articles, and focusing on the organization of critical information in a prescribed format. Students continue their exploration of words and letter patterns with their weekly word study, while squeezing in 15 minutes of daily reading time.

Math: After completing our unit on Data Relationships, we will be moving on to Coordinate Geometry and Motion Geometry. Students will learn about ordered pairs, and perform translations, reflections and rotations of shapes on a coordinate grid. Students will need to have their ruler and pencil crayons for this unit, so please be sure to check if your child still has these supplies or if replacements need to be purchased. Please also double check that your child still has a basic calculator, which will be needed for the remainder of the year.

Science: In Science, we will be completing our Sky Science unit and will begin to take a look at Air and Aerodynamics. We will be looking at the properties of air and the fact that it takes

up space, has mass, exerts pressure and is made up of gases. We are going to be doing lots of hands on experiments to study the effect that air has on us and the things on Earth.

Social Studies: This month, the students will be finishing off their unit on the Provincial Government with a reenactment of Alberta Legislature. After that, we will be moving on to the birthplace of democracy: Ancient Greece. There we will discover the roots of democracy, what it looked like, and how it affects us today.

Grade 7

LA - This month we are finishing our first book club and a major project that goes with that. We will be starting our next class novel *The Giver*, by Lois Lowry. It is a science fiction, dystopian style story, that even though it was written over twenty years ago, has many relevant themes and questions for us to discuss in our present-day society. Some of these discussions can become heavy and bring up different opinions, so we are also working on debating, speaking and listening skills. Students will learn to express their opinions in respectful ways while listening to others.

Math - This month students will be focusing on the fourth unit, this unit will look at linear relationships, describing patterns, graphing, and analyzing graphs to draw conclusions. At the completion of this unit the students will be writing their midterm exam. The midterm will cover the first four units and will take place between February 11-14. Please stay tuned for a message from your child's teacher for their specific midterm date. After the midterm the students will begin the fifth unit which focuses on solving equations.

Science - Following the completion of the midterm at the end of January, students began the third unit- Planet Earth. In this unit students will explore and observe; rocks, minerals, the rock cycle, erosion and weathering, layers of the Earth as well as earthquakes,volcanoes, fossils and fossil fuels. This unit will take us into the first part of March. Specific dates for any assignments and quizzes will be emailed to parents and guardians in advance.

Social Studies - We have officially completed the first half of our Social 7 course, "The push towards Confederation". Students will be writing their Social midterm within the first two weeks of February (specific class dates were sent out by individual teachers). We will then dive into the American War of Independence, the war of 1812 and eventually confederation. To go along with this material, teachers will be reading aloud the fictional book "Bully Boys" by Canadian author Eric Walters.

Grade 8

Language Arts (Mrs. Netzel)- We just finished up our Midterm exam and students should be very proud of how successful they were. We are also just finishing up our graphic character sketches based on the character from The Princess Bride film. We will be focusing on personal narrative writing the month of February. I can't wait to see the masterpieces these students create!

Math (Mrs. Berry-Furtado/Mr. Barfuss) - We will start the month of February off by reviewing for the Midterm. This is a cumulative exam covering Chapters 1 - 4. This includes fraction operations, integer operations, percent, ratios, rates, patterns, linear relations and graphing. At the completion of the Midterm exam, we will begin Chapter 5: Square Roots & Pythagorean Theorem .

Science (Mr. Olsen) - We are well on our way into the Light and Optical Systems Unit. We have explored how we use and benefit from different types of mirrors in our day to day life and how light reflects and is absorbed from one medium to another. We will be focusing on light refraction and lenses as we move into February.

Social Studies (Mr. Smith/Miss Cleland) - We have begun our Aztec unit and students are enjoying the content so far. This week in Mr. Smith's class we will be creating wax museums of the Aztec emperor Moctezuma II.
