


Returning Student Registration forms 2020-2021

Grade 5 POD

Language Arts: We have just finished our read-aloud study of *Mick Harte was Here* by Barbara Park, and will now apply the reading skills learned, to an independent chapter book project! Our writing will concentrate on complete sentences, as well as the difference between fragments and run-ons. This will be followed by a summative quiz as well as a writing assignment.



Social 5A/5B:We have completed our Mapping skills unit, including longitude and latitude and are beginning our adventure of touring across Canada, starting with the Atlantic region.

Social 5C/5D: We have been using our newly acquired map skills to show where, why, and how the Atlantic/Appalachian Region is connected and vital to the nation as a whole. As we have explored the climate, vegetation, wildlife, and natural resources there we have been discovering lots of amazing aspects of the Atlantic/Appalachian Region and are nearing completion on our first flipbook. Students have been using their textbooks, great online resources, and additional information from me as they move forward in creating a flipbook for each region.

Science 5A/5B: We have just finished our unit on Wetlands and now are studying Weather. We will look at different types of weather events and how they are created, air movement, how to measure different weather components like rain and wind, how to record weather, how weather impacts life and how we affect weather.

Science 5C/5D: Students presented their Google Slides presentation this week on their favourite season, and the water cycle. We will be starting a mini unit on weather instruments next, which will wrap up our weather unit by the end of October. In November, we will start our next unit: Wetlands. Students are encouraged to check their Google Classrooms once a week, or if they miss a day at school.

Math 5A/5B: We have wrapped up our introductory unit of Numeration and will be studying Multiplication. We will look at strategies for mental math multiplication, multiplication arrays and 2 digit by 2 digit multiplication. I encourage students to work on memorizing their times table.

Math 5C/5D: We will have wrapped up our multiplication unit towards the end of October or early November. Students will continue using multiplication throughout the year, however, so practicing memorizing their multiplication tables, as well as quick recall with single digit addition should be something they continue the entire year. Mid November we will begin to focus on subtraction and then division, and this unit will wrap up before the winter break.

Grade 6 POD


Language Arts- In Language Arts we are finishing up our first unit, paragraph writing: basic format using a guided template! There are comments in PowerSchool about the kiddos first project. They were very well done! We will now move into our new unit which is persuasive paragraph writing. In this unit we will dive deeper into paragraph writing and editing. From here we will move into grammar work.



Social - We have studied the basics of democracy and learned how we can put democracy into action in our own lives. We have reviewed our different rights and freedoms and discussed the most effective ways to come to a decision. In November, we will be taking an in-depth look at the different levels of government, beginning with the municipal government.

Science - We are coming to the end of our Trees and Forests unit. Students have been working hard on their final projects and will write their unit test in mid November. Please watch your email for a copy of the study guide for the unit test.

Math - As we start November, we will be continuing with our unit on Number Relationships. Once this unit is complete, we will begin our next unit about Patterns, Expressions and Equations. Please check with your child to make sure he/she has a calculator at school. A basic calculator is all that is required for Grade 6 Math. Also, remember that all notes and Skills Checks for Math 6 are posted in the Google Classroom. You will also find a section with some extra practice for the skills we've covered in our first two units.



Grade 7 POD

Language Arts - This month we will be focusing on our first large core text with the novel *The Giver* by Lois Lowry. This is one of my favourite novels; it is a dystopian fiction that relates very well to present-day issues. Students will also focus on literary analysis of the text as well as expressing their opinions. We will end the unit by watching the film *The Giver* and comparing it to the novel and discussing the changes between the two mediums and how they affect the story.



Social - We have been learning about the early European explorers that began settling in North America and their interest in finding a Northwest passage to Asia. In our next unit, we will be learning more about the colonization of North America. We will also be learning about the fur trade in North America.

Science - Once the Interactions & Ecosystems unit test has been completed, students will be starting to explore the Heat & Temperature unit. The production, transfer and transformation of heat energy plays an important role in meeting human needs. In learning about heat, students will investigate sources and uses of heat energy and consider the impact of resource usage on our long-term ability to meet energy needs!

Math - As the calendar turns to November, we will be moving onto our next unit: Fraction Operations. We will continue to develop our number sense as we explore adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers with like and unlike denominators.



Grade 8 POD

Language Arts 8:

Mrs. McDougall: In November, we will continue our "Deep Study of Character" reading unit by looking at how setting shapes characters. The students will learn about how characters are shaped by mood and atmosphere, how authors use precise language to describe the setting, and how characters can be influenced by the pressures of "place". We will end this month by



looking at how settings can change over time, not just physically, but psychologically, and what affect this can have on the characters in the texts we read.

Mrs. Netzel: This month, we are continuing with our work on our "Tell Your Story" Unit. Students are working through the "Elements of a Short Story" notes and will be having an exam on this material the beginning of November. Specific date and details to follow. We are diving into reading and analyzing various short stories, while applying the concepts of a short story. We continue to work on some grammar lessons, both through our Bellringers and our parts of speech focus.

Social: Our Italian City-State Simulation has come to a close and I feel as though the students have really gained some first hand experience of what it would have been like in the Renaissance. They learned that war was not the best way to make money, but trading and art was very lucrative. We will be moving into our study of humanism next. In this unit we will be studying Renaissance art and the changes it brought to society.

Science:

Students will be writing their first u hinit exam on Mix and Flow of Matter at the beginning of November. Next, we will begin our look into Fresh and Saltwater Systems. This unit will investigate the distribution of water on our planet and some of the issues we face in terms of water quality and water management. We will learn about the oceans, glaciers, and other freshwater resources.

Math:

This month, we will be finishing up Chapter 2: Percent, Ratio & Rate. Students will demonstrate an understanding of ratio and rate. Students will solve problems that involve rates, ratios and proportional reasoning. Finally, students will work with percents (greater to and less than 100%). Then, we will head into Chapter 3: Integers. This year, students will learn to both multiply and divide integers. We will review addition and subtraction of integers and eventually solve multiple operation problems involving integers (Order of Operations = BEDMAS). This will take us into the month of December.
