# **<u>RIBMS Dress Code</u>** as per the R.I. Baker Middle School Handbook

The primary objective at RIBMS is the academic success of all students; consequently, the dress policy allows for the conditions most conducive to learning, that students

can work comfortably and without distracting or disturbing others. The key principles of the policy call for dress to be CLEAN, NEAT and MODEST.

Students dressed inappropriately will be asked by their homeroom teacher to go to their lockers and change into appropriate clothing. It is understood that students will do this quickly and that the inappropriate clothing will be covered FOR THE DAY. If no appropriate clothing is available, the students will be directed to the office to either call home for suitable clothing, or be provided with clean clothing at the office. If a student needs to wait for a parent to bring appropriate clothing, the student will wear what is provided at the office for the interim, in order that the student can return to the classroom as soon as possible. The student can then go to the office at the next break to change into the appropriate clothing supplied by the parent.

Specific items that will not be worn to school include:

- Slippers
- Any revealing tank tops or halter tops
- Transparent or see-through fabrics
- Short tops that expose the midriff at ANY time
- Low cut tops
- Short shorts, skirt, or skorts (length will be at staff members discretion)
- T-shirts that are in poor taste\*
- Large winter jackets and coats are not to be worn in the classrooms
- Clothing that is designated underwear should be kept undercover

\*the dress code policy specifically prohibits clothing that contains logos or advertisements for drugs, alcohol, weapons or tobacco; that contains or 11 implies messages with sexual innuendo, or that appears to promote racism, discrimination, hate or illegal activities.

The dress policy applies to all school activities – dances, field trips, PE classes and extra-curricular sports practices, etc.

## **GRADE 5 POD**

Grade 5s were happy to return to in person learning towards the end of May, and are looking forward to a fun filled June! Thursday, **June 10th will be swimming for 5A and 5B**, and Wednesday, **June 16th will be swimming for 5C and 5D**. Be sure to send your child to school with their suit, towel, and anything else they may like (goggles, flip flops, etc).

**Monday, June 14th will be the grade 5's track meet at Kate Andrews.** Please send your child to school with proper footwear, a water bottle, a hat / sunscreen (optional) or anything else they may need (track outfit needs to follow school dress code).

**Monday, June 21st is Aboriginal Day** and grade 5s will participate in various activities celebrating Indigenous culture. The same day, Baker will participate in the **Eat Local Challenge**, and students will be provided with lunch from a local eatery.

Finally, on Thursday, June 24th, we will wrap up the year with a school wide fun day!

Friday, June 25th will be the last day of school with farewell assemblies.

**Language Arts:** We will wrap up our Friend or Foe Non-Fiction unit by having students create an original version of this mentor text, stating their reasons why a creature of their choosing may be a friend or foe. Additionally, we will be completing novel studies with each class in a literature circle format.

**Social 5A/5B:** As we approach the end of the year, we are entering our final unit in Social Studies! Here, we will compare and contrast the Cordillera and Interior Plains regions. Students will use a variety of resources to compile the information needed to compare the two regions.

**5C/5D:** We have finished our exploration of the six geographic regions of Canada, with a solid dose of history along the way. This week we are taking a good look at Canada's foundation and a variety of challenges and associated consequences. Our final unit will continue from here and look at key points in our shared national history, and those people or events have had an impact on our national identity.

**Science 5A/5B**: We are continuing to learn about chemistry, properties of matter, reactions and mixtures.

**Science 5C/5D:** We will continue learning about different types of circuits and electricity in the home until the end of the year.

**Math 5A/ 5B:** Hard to believe we are coming to the end of the year. We will wrap up Math this year with Addition and Subtraction of Decimals, probability and geometry.

**Math 5C/5D:** Towards the end of May we started geometry by introducing polygons, quadrilaterals and parallelograms. We will continue our geometry unit into the beginning of June and then finish the year with probability and a review of this year's skills.

# **GRADE 6 POD**

**Language Arts:** Welcome to June! What a year! To finish off the year in Language Arts we will be focusing on poetry. We will look at elements of poetry, we will learn about different devices to help us analyze poetry, and we will also work on writing our own poetry! If time allows we will end the year reviewing important writing and reading comprehension concepts.

**Social**: In Social, we will be starting (and hopefully finishing), our final unit: The Haudenosaunee Confederacy. During this unit we will look at how the Haudenosaunee Confederacy came to be, how their 'government' functioned, and what the culture was like amongst these clans. We will likewise take our prior knowledge of different governments and the way the societies we have learned about so far function, and compare them to the Haudenosaunee.

**Science 6A/6D** In Science, we will be focusing on evidence and investigation. Be prepared for your child to come home with investigative knowledge and application!

**Science 6B/6C:** June will see us examining and investigating a variety of types of "evidence" in our Evidence and Investigation unit. Students will explore shoe prints, fingerprints, handwriting samples, and ink evidence in this unit.

**Math 6A/6D** We will be working on our last unit, probability. We will also be practicing our division skills with our daily math starters.

**Math 6B/6C:** As June begins, we will do our final major unit on Probability, as well as some quick activities about sorting polygons, classifying triangles, and identifying congruent shapes. We will also revisit some of the skills we have been practicing with multiplying and dividing decimal numbers.



# **GRADE 7 POD**

#### Language Arts

7A and 7B - we will be wrapping up our year with an independent novel study. Students will pick a fictional book of their choice and will respond to questions about the plot, characters and themes of the novel.

7C and 7D are wrapping up their unit on the Holocaust and their novel study, *The Boy in the Striped Pajamas.* Students need parent permission to be able to watch the film once we finish the book. Please look for the email from Mr. Conrad on May 28, 2021. Students without consent will have an alternate activity during this time.

#### Social

We are finishing the year by looking at the Metis peoples, the National Policy and how the west was settled. We will then discuss how Canada's past still affects our present policies and society today.

#### Science

Students will work through the final science 7 unit, Structures and Forces until the end of June. They will have a chance to build their own structures and test them to explore the importance of structural stability, margin of safety, modes of failure, joints and material strengths. There will be no science 7 final exam this year.

#### Math

We will be completing the eighth and final unit of the year. The two sections include geometric constructions and Cartesian plane plotting and transformations. A few of the concepts we will be exploring are: perpendicular and parallel line segments, perpendicular and angle bisectors, plotting points using ordered pairs, as well as translations, rotations and reflections of points on a Cartesian plane. There will be no math 7 final exam this year.

### **GRADE 8 POD**

#### Language Arts

**Mr. Smith:** We are beginning our poetry unit with a special emphasis on spoken word poetry. In studying this unit, the students will understand that words are powerful, but there can also be power in the way in which they are said. Students will be exposed to many different poems that will help them complete their own original piece.

**Mrs. Netzel:** We have finished up our <u>Freak the Mighty</u> novel study, and are working on a cumulative essay to build on skills that will move students more confidently into grade 9. Students will build on the skills from their detailed graphic essay outlines they write in February and will work on attaining more fluency, format, and effective writing skills while developing thoughtful and well- supported details. We will then be moving into the last unit which is poetry! Students will work with figurative language to enhance their creativity and writing abilities. They will be exposed to various styles of poetry to analyze and appreciate. Focusing on this genre will encourage students to think deeply about text and ponder how our choice of words can lead to more powerful and vivid ideas.

#### Social

The Japan unit for the grade 8s is in full swing. Students are currently learning about the Edo Period in which the Shogun controlled Japan. When complete, we will be heading into the Meiji unit where the United States meets Japan and starts making economic and cultural changes. We will also leave time at the end of the year to study for our final exam. More information regarding this final assessment will be communicated in the coming weeks.

#### Science

The majority of June will be spent completing Unit E: Mechanical Systems. In learning about mechanical devices, students investigate how components are linked so that energy is transferred efficiently and desired functions are performed. A comparison of past and present technologies helps students recognize that different approaches have been used over time to meet common needs. Evaluations of efficiency, effectiveness and impacts on daily life, the community and the environment are important considerations in this unit. *The end of the year assessment, Wednesday June 23, will be our last Unit Exam (Unit E: Mechanical Systems). There will be no cumulative final exam.* 

#### Math

June will have us working on Chapter 8: Geometry. This is a project-based chapter and we will focus on tessellations. *A cumulative assessment will take place Tuesday, June 22. We will take time in class to review for this cumulative exam. Communication will be sent home regarding which chapters will be covered on this final (end of year) assessment.* 



With the current Covid 19 and Social DIstancing regulations in place, we have not been able to plan the traditional Gr. 8 Farewell Ceremony that many of our Gr. 8 students have looked forward to during their time at RI Baker.
