The primary objective at RIBMS is the academic success of all students; consequently, the dress policy allows for the conditions most conducive to learning, that students can work comfortably and without distracting or disturbing others. The key principles of the policy call for dress to be CLEAN, NEAT and MODEST.

Students dressed inappropriately will be asked by their homeroom teacher to go to their lockers and change into appropriate clothing. It is understood that students will do this quickly and that the inappropriate clothing will be covered FOR THE DAY. If no appropriate clothing is available, the students will be directed to the office to either call home for suitable clothing, or be provided with clean clothing at the office. If a student needs to wait for a parent to bring appropriate clothing, the student will wear what is provided at the office for the interim, in order that the student can return to the classroom as soon as possible. The student can then go to the office at the next break to change into the appropriate clothing supplied by the parent.

Specific items that will not be worn to school include:

- Slippers
- Any revealing tank tops or halter tops
- Transparent or see-through fabrics
- Short tops that expose the midriff at ANY time
- Low cut tops
- Short shorts, skirt, or skorts (length will be at staff members discretion)
- T-shirts that are in poor taste*
- Large winter jackets and coats are not to be worn in the classrooms
- Clothing that is designated underwear should be kept undercover

*the dress code policy specifically prohibits clothing that contains logos or advertisements for drugs, alcohol, weapons or tobacco; that contains or 11 implies messages with sexual innuendo, or that appears to promote racism, discrimination, hate or illegal activities.

The dress policy applies to all school activities – dances, field trips, PE classes and extra-curricular sports practices, etc.

Volleyball Coaches Needed

We are in need of volleyball coaches for all of our teams next school year. We are looking for head coaches and assistant coaches. Experience playing and coaching volleyball is an asset, but not required. We are hoping to find enough volunteers to have 2 coaches per team.

Our Jr boys and girls teams play in the COLJHAA League (County) and a few tournaments. They practice twice a week and sometimes have two games a week. With about 3 or 4 tournaments sprinkled in. The majority of the Jr games are all triple ball rules. Our Jr teams are developmental in philosophy and are equal playing time for league games and tournaments. Our Jr teams are made up a few grade 6s, mostly grade 7s, and a few grade 8s.

Our Sr boys and girls teams play in the LSAA League (City of Lethbridge league). They practice twice a week, and when league starts also have two games every week. They will play in 4 or 5 tournaments. The start of the season is triple ball, with the second half all regular volleyball. Our Sr teams are also developmental, but blended with a competitive philosophy. They are not always equal playing time. Our Sr teams are made up mainly grade 8s, with only a couple grade 7s.



Tuesday, June 22nd we will be taking a curriculum based field trip to Writing on Stone.

Monday, June 27th, grade 5, 6 and 7 students will travel to Raymond Pool.

Tuesday, June 28 will be Farewell assemblies. The grade 5 assembly will be from 9:50 - 10:35.

Language Arts: We will be wrapping up our Book Club unit, where students have been reading novels in small groups and completing weekly assignments. After that, we will be completing our final class novel-study for the year, *The Witches*, a classic fantasy by Roald Dahl. We will also be having a third Journal Spotlight event!

Social: As we approach the end of the year, we are entering our final unit in Social Studies! Here, we will compare and contrast the Cordillera and Interior Plains regions. Students will use a variety of resources to compile and present the information needed to compare the two regions.

Science 5: We are continuing to learn about chemistry, properties of matter, reactions and mixtures. We will complete some fun, hands-on experiments throughout this unit!

Math 5: Hard to believe we are coming to the end of the year. We will wrap up Math this year with Addition and Subtraction of Decimals, probability and geometry.





GRADE 6 POD

*All PATs will begin in the morning. Remember to get a good night's sleep, have a healthy breakfast, arrive on time, have at least 2 sharpened HB pencils, an eraser and a highlighter.

Language Arts: I can't believe it is already JUNE! What a year! To finish off the year in Language Arts we will be focusing on poetry. We will look at elements of poetry, we will learn about different devices to help us analyze poetry, and we will also work on writing a little of our own poetry! We will also be doing some terminology review before the PAT and some practice reading comprehension. **The LA PART B PAT is in the morning on June 16, 2022.**

Social: In Social Studies, we are wrapping up our unit on the Iroquois Confederacy. In this unit, we looked at how their "government" functioned, and what the culture was like amongst the Six Nations and the clans. Moving forward, we will take a quick look at Chapter 7, Making a Just and Fair Canada, before some final prep for the PAT.

Science: June will see us examining and investigating a variety of types of "evidence" in our Evidence and Investigation unit. Students will explore shoe prints, fingerprints, handwriting samples, and ink evidence in this unit. We will begin our cumulative review for all the science units we covered this year, mid June. **Science PAT is Wednesday. June 22rd.**

Math: As June begins, we will do our final major unit on Statistics & Probability, as well as beginning review of all units learned this year; especially multi digit operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division; these are used across all of our other units so it is especially important to be comfortable with these skills). **Math PAT is Monday, June 20th.**

GRADE 7 POD

Grade 7 Final Exam Schedule:

Friday, June 17 - Math Monday, June 20 - Social Wednesday, June 22 - Science Thursday, June 23 - LA

Language Arts

We will be finishing our poetry unit with a poetry portfolio. Students will hand in the best of their poetic writing as their major project. We will then spend some time reviewing the material we learned for the last half of the year to prepare for our final exam.

Social

We are finishing the year by looking at how immigaration has shaped Canada as we know it today. We will also be taking a closer look at more recent social and political changes. Students will then have time to review for their final exam which will be on Monday, June 20th.

Science

Students will finish working through the final science 7 unit, Structures and Forces. They will explore the importance of structural stability, margin of safety, modes of failure, joints and material strengths. Then students will review for the final exam which will be on Wednesday, June 22. The final will only cover our last three units: Planet Earth, Heat and Temperature, as well as Structures and Forces.

Math

After completing our Data Analysis unit, we will be moving onto our final unit of the year about Geometry. A few of the concepts we will be exploring are: perpendicular and parallel line segments, angle bisectors, plotting points using ordered pairs, as well as translations, rotations and reflections of points on a Cartesian plane. The final exam for Math 7 will happen on **Friday, June 17**, and it will cover all of our units completed since our first midterm exam in February.



GRADE 8 POD

Humanities (LA/Social)

Rising Sun, Bending Reed, our two-month-long competitive Project-Based game, is coming to its conclusion this month. Students have had the experience of the Japanese people during the stressful journey of their country. They will have a chance to showcase what they have learned as individuals, and will be completing their final summative pieces. Mr. Willems and Mr. Smith are very happy with the results we have seen; thank you grade 8's for such great participation! The Language Arts final exam will be on June 17th and the Social final will be on June 23rd.

Science

The materials we use- including natural and manufactured ones- often take the form of fluids. Students learn about such diverse substances as air, natural gas, water and oil that are all fluids. In further investigations, they discover that many common household materials are aqueous solutions or suspensions in which the main component is water. Students learn that the properties of individual fluids are important to their use, including such properties as density, buoyancy, viscosity and the fluid's response to changes in temperature and pressure. Students will investigate the particle model of matter which is used to make a conceptual link between the nature of matter and the specific behavior of fluids. **We are scheduled to write our Science final on Wednesday, June 22nd.**

Math

To begin, June will have us concluding Chapter 7: Data Analysis & Probability. Then, we will wrap up the year by working on our final chapter - Chapter 8: Geometry. This is a project-based chapter and we will focus on tessellations. *The FINAL EXAM will take place Monday, June 20. We will take time in class to review for this cumulative exam. Communication will be sent home regarding which chapters will be covered on this final assessment.*
