RIBMS School P/C Meeting May 10, 2022 Trustee Report

Elisabeth Pascal (ECS teacher at Sunnyside) has been named the 2022 Palliser School Division Board of Trustees' nominee for the prestigious Edwin Parr Teacher Award. A banquet will be held in Taber on May 18, 2022 to honour all nominees in Zone 6 and a winner will be announced. (Zone 6 is located in Southern Alberta made up of 9 school divisions) This award, named in honour of Edwin Parr, former president of the Alberta School Boards Association, was established almost 60 years ago to recognize outstanding first-year teachers.

April Board Meeting Highlights

- 1) The Wellness goal of the division focuses on students becoming literate in mental health, gaining knowledge that will provide them confidence in their pursuit of living a healthy life. The Family School Liaison Counselors (FSLC) team provide one to one and group counseling to students in anxiety, trauma, grief and a multitude of other areas. In the past year, there were over 748 classroom presentations related to wellness.
- 2) The division-wide Literacy Team carries out the Literacy Framework which emphasizes the key areas of Oral Language, and Digital Literacy across grade levels and subjects. This year, staff attended over 40 division-wide learning opportunities related to literacy.
- 3) A Numeracy Team has been established to engage leaders, teachers, students and community to further the division's numeracy framework. Focus will continue on key areas of elementary numeracy: number sense, mathematical reasoning, visual math, and problem solving. An online platform will allow staff to share resources, plans and projects across the division.

May Board Meeting Highlights

- 1) Dr. Browning presented the English Language Learners report. We have 3,370 students with the largest number in Calgary, over 500 students in Lethbridge area schools, over 100 students in Vulcan area, and 331 students in colony schools. The focus of the program is on key areas of oral language, vocabulary and content area literacy. Palliser has coordinated professional learning opportunities with other school divisions specific to English language. The team has implemented new early literacy assessments which are helping students receive credits while obtaining the level of English proficiency necessary for high school courses.
- 2) Update on the new school build will be held on May 24 at RIBMS and May 25 at KAHS from 4:30 5:30 for staff and 6:00 to 7:30 for the public. Next Board Meeting is June 14, 2022

RIBMS Year End Chair Report

Thank you to everyone who has attended our council meetings this year. I really feel it is a great source of information to keep families informed of what is happening around RI Baker.

We are thankful that lately we have been able to host a few activities, one of which was funded by the Government provided ASCE School Council Grant money. This Grant was to be used for parent engagement and thankfully we were able to already put this grant to great use. Ted Emmett came to RI Baker on March 31st and gave a great presentation titled "A Post Pandemic Look at Technology and Adolescent Online Activity". This was a great night with many parents and students in attendance. The presentation was shared with Baker families on the website and has some great information about how to start the conversation about social media with your child, and how to come to an understanding about rights vs. privilege.

I attended the (Alberta School Councils' Association) ASCA annual general meeting on Sunday, April 24th. There was lots of information shared throughout the day, mostly updating the ASCA Bylaws and adopting a new meeting structure. There were a few takeaways:

- ASCA has many resources for parents and members of School Council. It is great to know there is a governing body to contact if there was ever a situation that needed some clarification.
- There was a motion made to submit a request to the Government to restore funding to ASCA. The funding ASCA received was cut previously earlier this year. The motion was passed and a letter of support will be send to the Government requesting the funding be reinstated.

Thank you again for sticking with me this year. It has been both the longest and shortest school year yet.
