#### **Reminders:**

As partners in your child's education, it is important that we work together to ensure that the students are attending school on a regular basis, and completing assignments. The grade 5 teachers felt that this was a good time to remind parents of a few items:

- Some students are running out of a few of the basic supplies and need **pencils**, whiteboard markers, glue sticks and/or erasers. Please check with your child to see if they are short of supplies.
- There are a few children who have been wearing their boots all day long. Please ensure that your child has indoor shoes to wear at school during the winter months.

Make sure to look for weekly emails from your child's grade 5 homeroom teacher for specific updates in regards to activities and learning opportunities happening each week. Please let your child's teacher know if you are not receiving these emails.

#### **GRADE 6 POD**

#### MATH - MACKLIN

In January students will start looking at their third unit - Fractions, Decimals & Percent. They will convert between improper fractions and mixed numbers, look at ratio, and show understanding of percent (limited to whole numbers). All information is posted in google classroom to stay caught up while students are away, or if they need extra practice.

#### <u> LANGUAGE ARTS - NETZEL</u>

Happy New Year! Students will be continuing to work on our short story unit by reading and focusing on comprehending a few more short stories. Then, students will be working on their paragraph writing skills. I encourage all students to read a few hours/week over the holiday season!

#### SOCIAL STUDIES - CONRAD

Students in social studies have completed the chapter on Local Government. After the holidays, we will turn our focus to the Provincial Government. There are a handful of students who have outstanding assignments (vocabulary and/or quiz corrections). The two weeks off would be a perfect time to ensure that everything is handed in for social studies.

#### SCIENCE - MACKLIN

We will wrap up our Sky Science unit this month with a Unit Test happening mid January. Students completed 2 booklets about our solar system, moon phases, the seasons, constellations, eclipses, as well as other topics. They also wrote 2 quizzes during this unit and can use these for review as well. Next, we will be starting our Air & Aerodynamics unit! Keep checking Google Classroom as we'll be doing lots of experiments around the properties of air, including creating all types of flying and floating machines. Students may need to bring items from home, but plenty of notice will be given ahead of time.

#### **GRADE 7 POD**

#### MATH-MRS.SMART

As we start 2024, students will be working through our third unit, which consists of the addition and subtraction of integers. In this unit, students will add and subtract integers with the use of manipulatives, diagrams, and symbols (actual numbers). Students should have red and blue markers/pencil crayons for this unit!

#### SOCIAL STUDIES - MS.SERBU

We will be starting the year fresh by beginning Chapter 6 which focuses on the beginnings of the provinces and territories coming together to form what is now present day Canada as well as the people that made it happen. All material will be made available on Google Classroom as we cover it in class.

#### LANGUAGE ARTS- MRS. HUFF

Welcome back! Our unit on The Giver will be wrapping up this month. We will complete the unit by honing our opinion writing and argumentative writing skills in our "Mock Trial" where the students will debate the fate of one of the characters from the book. Students will also write a mid-term exam after the completion of this unit covering everything we have learned up to this point. Stay tuned for specific dates to come.

#### SCIENCE- MRS. SMART

Students will start the month by reviewing for about a week, for their midterm covering the first two units of the year. Then, we will start our third unit – Planet Earth. This scientific study of Earth will be based on direct observation of landforms and materials that make up Earth's surface and on the sample evidence and models we have of Earth's interior. Reminder to use Google Classroom to catch up on any missed classes!

#### GRADE 8 POD

#### MATH-MRS. BERRY

During the month of January, we will be working through Chapter 4: Patterns & Relations. It begins with students analyzing linear relations through equations, graphs and tables of values. Next, we will explore solving equations. This is an extension of Math 7. We will utilize algebra-tiles to help us understand all of the steps required to solve different equations. At the conclusion of Chapter 4, we will spend some time preparing for the Midterm. This is a cumulative exam assessing Chapters 1 – 4. The Midterm is scheduled for February!

#### SOCIAL STUDIES-MR. SMITH

Happy New Year and welcome back. We will be completing our study of the Renaissance unit with some time to study for our mid-term which will include everything we have learned from the beginning of the year until now. In mid-January we will be starting our study of the Aztec Empire in January. The main concept of this unit is to understand what happens if a society chooses to fight back against their conquerors.

#### LANGUAGE ARTS-MR. WILLEMS

Happy New Year! Throughout the rest of January, we will be engaged in our 'Picture Books: Say Something' unit. Our focus will be on editing and enhancing stories, acquiring new tools to improve our writing from good to great. With the arrival of the new year, it is also an appropriate time for reflection and goal setting. We will continue our ongoing activities, which include journaling, reading, watching, and storytelling. Towards the end of the month, we will embark on our new miniunit on Word Gathering (Etymology).

#### SCIENCE-MR. GINTHER

In the New Year students will finish their Freshwater & Salt water Systems unit and start our Mix & Flow of Matter unit. The materials we use- including natural and manufactured ones- often take the form of fluids. Students learn that such diverse substances as air, natural gas, water and oil are fluids. In further investigations, they discover that many common household materials are aqueous solutions or suspensions in which the main component is water. Students learn that the properties of individual fluids are important to their use, including such properties as density, buoyancy, viscosity and the fluid's response to changes in temperature and pressure. The particle model of matter is used to make a conceptual link between the nature of matter and the specific behavior of fluids.

It is our hope that each child will attend this event and either learn the basics of skiing or practice their ski skills and HAVE FUN!! For students who do not go skiing, it is a regular school day where grade level instruction will be provided. We do need a majority of our students to participate in this event, or it may be cancelled. We strongly encourage and welcome parents to attend the ski day with your child.

\*\*Ski trip fees and forms are due January 31, 2024.\*\*

In accordance with procedures at Castle Mountain, every student must take an ability test and lesson, even if they are a season pass holder. All students must wear a helmet, the cost of which is included if they rent equipment.

In order to plan and order adequate transportation, every student needs to ride the bus to and from the ski hill. All students who are attending the ski trip must attend a ski safety presentation at the school.

As this activity is partially subsidized by the school, please note that school fees and any other outstanding fees are to be paid in full prior to the ski date. Please call the office, 345–3340, if you would like details on outstanding fees or to speak to an administrator regarding payment plans to pay fees.

Parents accompanying our students on the ski trip will be expected to adhere to Palliser Regional School policy in regard to tobacco and alcohol.

**Please Note:** Students and parents who choose not to participate on the school ski trip but choose to ski that day (at Castle Mountain) will not in any way be affiliated with the school, its insurance, discounted rates or transportation. Also, if a student drives with a parent or another parent they become the responsibility of that parent. If a student who is not on the ski trip is a discipline issue or is injured they are the sole responsibility of the overseeing guardian.
